Director, Midwifery Education, Developing Midwives Project

To develop competent and compassionate Midwives to improve the maternal and neonatal health in Bangladesh the James P Grant School of Public Health, BRAC University has been implementing the Diploma in Midwifery Education Programme under Developing Midwives Project at seven Academic Sites, in hard-to-reach and underserved areas across the country since 2012. The programme is being implemented in partnership with six Non-Government Organizations, with support from the Government of Bangladesh. It is funded by UKAid from the UK Government since 2012. James P Grant School of Public Health, BRAC University also plans to start a B.Sc. programme on Midwifery starting in 2018.

The Director Midwifery Education will be initially filled up by an expatriate expert in Midwifery, who will be gradually phased out after building local capacity. This position will draw support from Consultants, e.g. Content Development Consultant/Faculty Development Consultant from time to time. S/he will be closely supervised by the Head, Midwifery Education Programme & Project Director, Developing Midwives Project: Phase 2.

Job profile

Responsibilities

- Develop capacity of the Midwifery Education Team especially Team Leader, Midwifery Education Team to take on higher levels of responsibility
- Support and nurture the Academic Site to develop their capacities in managing and delivering the Diploma in Midwifery course independently
- Ensure that contents of the curriculum (including modules, assessment processes and other relevant areas)
 are completed as per the specifications/mandate of Bangladesh Nursing and Midwifery Council and
 International Confederation of Midwives, in time
- Ensure that faculty development plans are in place and are executed timely
- Ensure that the Demonstration Centers are running smoothly
- Develop the academic calendar and ensure that academic activities in all Academic sites and at BRAC University are taking place as per plan
- Develop a network with potential mentoring specialists and support development of local mentors so that the mentoring sessions twice every year can be held in an uninterrupted manner
- Ensure the growth and development of a set of Bangladeshi mentors under the guidance and with support from the international mentors
- Intervene if necessary to ensure smooth flow of activities in all Academic sites
- Participate in planning and overseeing students' admission and examination processes
- Represent the Project/education programme in appropriate national and international forums
- Ensure strong team building within the Midwifery Education and Academic site's team and to contribute actively to team building of the bigger Project team
- Participate in meetings of various projects related committees; represent the programme in BRAC University/James P Grant School of Public Health forums
- Ensure that Midwifery Education related project outcomes/outputs are achieved. Contribute to development of project plans and reports; coordinate in receiving inputs from Midwifery Education team for the report; participate in finalization of the quarterly and annual reports to be submitted to DFID
- Provide inputs in development and maintenance/implementation of the Midwifery Management information system, communication and research plans
- Actively support, guide and manage Team Leader of Midwifery Education, Professor of post-basic BSc faculty
- Develop strong linkages with International Confederation of Midwives. Secure the Programmer's participation/involvement in important International Confederation of Midwives events/tasks
- Work with relevant parties including the government, UNFPA, International Confederation of Midwives and others in developing Midwifery as an independent profession in Bangladesh

Requirement

- Registered midwife with post graduate or equivalent level of education in midwifery/nursing, PhD shall be preferred;
- A minimum of 10 years of work experience in teaching midwifery including at postgraduate level in Asia and/or other countries with 8 years or more of clinical experience in maternal and newborn health. Experience of providing technical assistance in recruiting Mentors, Consultants for development of Course

Content, Development and review of the Modules, Curriculum and development of learning packages and evaluation system for Diploma and the B.Sc. Course in Midwifery etc.

- Excellent interpersonal skills with the ability to work in teams and with staff at all levels;
- Confident communicator with the ability to communicate effectively, both orally and in writing. Ability to work productively and co-operatively as a team member and to develop flexible working relationships with academic and non-academic colleagues and students;
- Willing to work in Bangladesh for a minimum period of two years and to travel extensively for monitoring visits of seven academic sites and internationally (if needed);
- This position will be a full-time contractual position.
